

TLILIC0005 – Licence to operate a boom type EWP

Course Description:

This unit specifies the skills and knowledge required to safely operate a boom-type elevating work platform where the length of the boom is 11 metres or more. Boom-type elevating work platform means a telescoping device, hinged device, or articulated device, or any combination of these, used to support a platform on which personnel, equipment and materials may be elevated.

A person performing this work is required to hold a boom-type elevating work platform high risk work (HRW) licence.

This unit requires a person operating a boom-type elevating work platform to plan the work, conduct routine checks, set up elevating work platform, operate elevating work platform, and shut down and secure elevating work platform..

Entry Requirements:

Must be at least 18 years old – Licensing requirement

Pre-Requisite:

N/A

Duration:

16 hours (2 days)

Venue:

On-Site training. To be confirmed during the booking process

Participants:

6 participants maximum (minimum 4 people)

Food/Beverages:

To be provided onsite by the client or discussed prior to starting.

Site Requirements:

PPE to be work as per site requirements – Suggested minimum - Hi visibility vest/clothing, hard hat and safety boots, glasses

Material Supplied:

All training material is supplied by MBE training. Client must supply forklift and items to be lifted as per practical requirements. Equipment checklist is provided before enrolment.

Note: If assessment requirements onsite can not be meet the course will not be able to start and other arrangement must be arranged

Assessment:

Trainees will be assessed against the endorsed assessment instrument, which includes knowledge assessments, assignment (maths) and practical assessment.

Outcome:

Once competence is achieved, trainees will receive a Statement of Attainment and a notice of assessment which may be used to apply for a licence to perform high risk work – Operate a boom type EWP

Language, literacy and numeracy:

The assessment process is broken into three sections and attendees must have basic English skills to complete the assessments. All assessments are a closed book exam and must be conducted in English. The use of an interpreter is not allowed.

Other information:

The training and assessment will involve operating a boom type EWP to a minimum of 75% of its capacity as well as bending, twisting and lifting objects. Trainees will need to have the basic fitness required to undertake these practical tasks.

Cost:

\$600 per person
(If retest is required a cost of \$300 will be charged)

There is also an application fee to Worksafe Victoria when applying for the licence. The applicant (or employer) will be responsible for paying this fee to Worksafe Victoria.

Travel + (gst) will be charged at \$1.00 per km if more than 50km from MBE office.
(GST is not charged on nationally recognised training)

If accommodation is required it is charged at costs charged to MBE Training.
